## Hello HumaneCNY Supporter:

It's only halfway through 2024, and we are trending to exceed our medical care budget very soon. Already this year, our medical care budget has saved animals like Kenzo, Nyle, Leonard, and countless others who arrived at our shelter sickly, emaciated, and in need of urgent care. Starved Pit Mix, Kenzo was found by a good Samaritan and needed many vet appointments to monitor his weight gain. Leonard, another emaciated Pit Mix, required extensive surgery for a full intestinal blockage. Tuxedo cat, Nyle, had intense daily seizures after suffering head trauma abuse as a stray. To keep Nyle comfortable, Nyle received daily medications and was monitored closely by a

veterinarian. We were fortunate to give Nyle seven peaceful months with his loving foster before he crossed the Rainbow Bridge.

Most recently, we've saved Frisco, Dottie, Pippa, and Belinda. Frisco is a small, senior Terrier mix. Instead of treating a horrible flea infestation, his owner tied a plastic cone around his neck for five years to keep him from constantly itching. He arrived unneutered with scabbed, furless patches all over his body. On the first day Frisco arrived, we spent \$200 on his vet appointment, flea treatment, antibiotics, and medicated shampoos. By the time Frisco is healthy enough to be adopted, we estimate that we'll have spent nearly \$1,000, especially if he requires further testing to determine if he has environmental or food allergies. For now, Frisco is resting comfortably at HumaneCNY with a sweater and a soft cone to ease his pain and to stop him from itching his open wounds.

Dottie is a 5-year-old Shih Tzu that was abandoned at the shelter. After a haircut and a vet appointment, we learned that Dottie was unspayed and suffering from severe double eye infections. On top of that, she also needs a mammary tumor removed. The tumor removal, spay, antibiotics, and possible eye removal is estimated to cost nearly \$1,500. Dottie is happy in a long-term foster home receiving her daily medications and lots of love and care.

While young mama cat, Belinda, and spritely kitten, Pippa, are not related, they have eye removal surgery in common. Pippa came to HumaneCNY at just two months old with a terribly infected eye, which was likely caused by an untreated upper respiratory infection. Pippa's eye was in bad shape, but that didn't stop her from romping and playing like a normal kitten in her extra-extra small cone! Because she was so small, Pippa waited nearly a month before her surgery as she didn't meet the minimum weight requirement for anesthesia. On the other hand, 1-year-old Belinda's eye injury was likely the result of fighting with other cats while she was a stray, pregnant cat in need of our help.

We know saving just one animal won't change the world, but it will change the world for that one animal. However, despite our best efforts, we can only do so much without the funds we desperately need. Your support gives us the resources we need to continue our mission of sheltering our local homeless animals with love and compassion.
